Stay Vigilant When Using the Panmure Bridge to Pakuranga



Locals that travel on the Panmure Bridge to Pakuranga and vice versa will be aware that dynamic lane LED road markers on the Panmure side of the bridge (i.e. turning left from Church Crescent to the bridge, travelling straight from Lagoon Drive) have not been working for many months now. The PBA has received multiple complaints and queries about this. After months of going back and forth with Auckland Transport (AT), we have received the following response:

“Please be advised the overhead gantry signals are functioning correctly, as they have been for the past 30 years, prior to the advent of new technologies like LED

road markers. Regrettably, the LED road markers have demonstrated unreliability at this location and have been permanently deactivated to reduce confusion for motorists.

Please note, no new LED road markers will be installed, nor will replacements be contemplated until a comprehensive evaluation of the current system is concluded.”

We urge road users to please continue to proceed with caution and stay vigilant on this strip of road – especially when visibility is impaired by fog or rain. For any further queries regarding this, please contact AT directly at contact.at.govt.nz.
