### Panmure's Basin Fun Day Postponed to 2026



anmure's Basin Fun Day will take a break in 2025 and return in 2026.
Due to disruptions from planned upgrades by Watercare and Eke Panuku Development Auckland, the event cannot be held in 2025. While this year's event did proceed, despite weather-related postponement, the closure of the Jubilee Bridge certainly impacted its delivery.

As the umbrella funder of the event, the PBA is disappointed that we won't be able to hold the event in 2025. However, our priority is to deliver a safe and enjoyable experience that fully celebrates the Basin's natural environment, free from disruptions and health and safety concerns.

### The Panmure Historic Hotel Has New Owners!

ew owners have been found for the Panmure Historic Hotel, the second property recently offered for sale by the Mount Wellington Licensing Trust group.

Troy Elliott, President of Mount Wellington Licensing Trust says: "We are extremely pleased to have secured an agreement with LZ Holding that will see them continue to operate The Corner Bar for the foreseeable future, including maintaining the gaming operations which will enable the net gaming machine proceeds to continue to be donated to our community," says Mr Elliott.

Mount Wellington Trust Hotels has now found buyers for both of its properties

- The Waipuna Hotel & Conference Centre, and The Panmure Historic Hotel - with both achieving competitive sale prices. By selling and investing the proceeds, Mount Wellington Licensing Trust will be able to fulfil its purpose of community giving. For many years Mount Wellington Licensing Trust has struggled to return profits from its hospitality and accommodation operations to the community, with more than 92 per cent of community donations coming from gaming machine proceeds.

### **Auckland Alcohol Laws Are Changing**



rom 9th December, the maximum trading hours for new and existing alcohol licensed businesses will change. From this date:

- bottle shops and supermarkets across Tāmaki Makaurau Auckland will not be able to sell alcohol after 9pm;
- bars, restaurants and other onlicences permitted by the District Licensing Committee will be able to sell alcohol until no later than 3am outside of the central city, and 4am in the central city;

 sports clubs and RSAs permitted by the District Licensing Committee will be able to sell alcohol until 1am.

he policy will not impact special licences for festivals and events.
These will continue to be assessed by the District Licensing Committee.

This change has been nearly a decade in the making as a move to increase health, safety and wellbeing across the region by reducing alcohol harm, and the costs associated with them. You can find more information about this change on the Auckland Council website.
