The SGM was held for our members to vote to approve and ratify amendments to our Constitution. While this SGM marks a rare instance in which such a meeting has been held in the PBA's history, it was a necessary and timely exercise. Key amendments to our Constitution reflect the impacts of operating during a global pandemic; where we could not hold meetings in person, codify processes that over time have become standard practice, as well as future proof for upcoming wider legislative changes that affect our Constitution (i.e. Incorporated Societies Act).

Members voted in favour of the Constitutional Amendments, with no objections and one abstention. The evening was an all-round success, with members remarking that having a "networking hour" was a great opportunity to wind down from the day and chat

local eateries!), before proceeding to the



Panmure Skatepark is set for an upgrade



ke Panuku Development Auckland,
Auckland Council's urban
regeneration agency, will begin
installing a new quarter pipe and modifying
some of the existing ledges, rails, and
ramps at the popular recreation space later
this month to bring it up to date for today's
skating needs.

The lagoon skatepark is a popular destination with a wide range of skating groups, who use it on a regular basis. The new works are aimed at improving safety for skaters and to provide better use of the area.

Eke Panuku has been working with skating

groups on the upgrade and their feedback has helped shape the final design.

Construction work is expected to begin May 29 and will take around three months to complete. During this time, the skatepark and immediate surrounding area will be closed and fenced off for safety and security reasons.

The northern footpath will have a temporary deviation in place and the carpark will remain open for the community.

This is one of many investments Eke Panuku is making in Panmure over the next decade as part of the Unlock Panmure programme, which aims to reinvigorate the town centre into becoming a great place to live, visit and do business.
