he Christmas season is often a joyful time, but it can also prove to be a high-stress environment with a heavy economic burden. These festive pressures can bleed into our business community, so our message to members is to be extra vigilant for scams- be careful of fake notes, texts from unknown numbers citing overdue fines, and invoice scams. For anyone making purchases off of Marketplace or similar sites, take care to verify the seller before any payments are made. Where possible, do not go alone if you are picking up your purchase-caution is always the safest route.

With the festive season now here, we would also like to kindly remind our members, and the public, that the Panmure Town Centre has

a 24/7 alcohol ban. Under this by-law, people are prohibited from carrying or drinking alcohol in public places within the town centre. This includes consuming alcohol in vehicles. It does not cover licensed premises, including any outdoor seating attached to licensed premises. If unsure, please consult the Auckland Council Alcohol Control Bylaw webpage online.

### Where have the bins gone?



Many of you will have noticed that our bins are gone in the Eastern part of town. They have been removed to be refurbished as part of Eke Panuku's Streetscape Refresh. Those with keen eyes will have noted that our western part of town has updated green and dark red seating and bins. This is part of the same outdoor furniture refresh initiative. The PBA has been assured that the seating and bins

will be back before Christmas. In response to the refurbishment timing, Auckland Council's street rubbish removal team have been highly active to mitigate the amount of litter visible throughout the day. We are aware that the removal of the bins and seating have been inconvenient and thank members and the public for their continued patience- it will be worth it to have an updated look in 2024!

### Panmure's Train Services Back in 2024!

Commuters, locals, and businesses rejoice! With Stage 2 of the Rail Network Rebuild completed, our currently closed stations on the Eastern Line- which includes the Panmure Train Station-will reopen and services resume on 15 January 2024. However, please

note that as the Waitematā Station will remain closed for CRL works until 21 January, Eastern Line services will run between Manukau and The Strand (near the bottom of Parnell Rise) for that week. From 22 January services will resume travelling to Waitematā.
