with a cash refund and goods, however the online payment was never processed. Multiple businesses were targeted. The police are aware of this guy, we have passed on all details we have and they are following up.

I was recently invited to speak to an English class at Papakura High School after their teacher heard my interview on RNZ about ram raids. They also had the police and a social worker come to speak to them. I found the

class really engaged with lots of questions, after my talk about the destructive direction some youth are taking. What really hit home was when I relayed the terrible effect ram raids for example have on the victims. Het the class know how in Panmure we understand youth behaviour, we know who is involved and can predict the outcomes. We do a very good job of staying ahead of the game due to our close liaison with police and various community groups.

Our local police will be bringing back their morning 'Coffee with a Cop' sessions at Café With No Name. Please come along to one of these with your questions and concerns. Our engagement with the police is valuable for us and them so we can keep on top of crime in our area. The next two sessions are 7th & 16th September 8-9am. Coffee is the PBA's shout!
