The exhibition is a celebration of imagination through reused materials. Ordinary items have been transformed into dynamic sculptures out of a science fiction world. The gallery has already received visitors who adore the creations, and the humorous placards that tell their story. It may be surprising to know the creator of these impressive pieces never went to

art school! Sean's creative journey began in 2012 with the creation of a ray gun that became a popular auction on Trade Me. From then, he kept creating - completing over 135 sculptures.

lan Duncan, owner of Studio Gallery, is ecstatic to feature Sean's work as the opening exhibition. He hopes to give unique art more attention. Both men are passionate about bringing art to the ordinary person. Sean has even run workshops in schools to help kids with their own creations. They see the space

SECURITY UPDATE

e are seeing an increase of anti-social behaviour within the town centre and reiterate to our businesses, and the public, that they must report these incidents to Police using 105- either online or via phone. 105 is the non-emergency reporting line. In an emergency, always dial 111. By reporting incidents via 105, Police can then see where there are hotspots of activity within and around our town centre, discern and extrapolate any crime patterns, and inform their patrolling activity. While it may seem inconvenient, or not worthwhile, to report non-emergency incidents or minor infractions such as intimidating behaviour or small value card fraud, we urge our members to not take these lightly. As recent events within the town centre have shown, repeat offending is a serious problem so please report to 105 should you see or experience this kind of activity. When reporting suspicious activity, descriptions of the alleged individual(s) are very helpful for Police. Descriptions such as gender,

age, build, clothes they are wearing as well as any other identifying characteristics- for example, tattoos, piercings, or jewellery. When reporting a theft, the details you report make a big difference in the Police's decision to progress an investigation. As well as the details mentioned earlier, if possible: note the time of the event, provide a description and value of the goods, include photos of the items if available, and include number plate and vehicle description if you suspect or know a vehicle was involved. Also include the contact details of anyone who saw the offending with their own eyes. The more thorough the information reported, the better chance the offender will be held to account. For anyone who would like a reporting checklist, please let our office know and we can provide one.
