Plastic products banned from 1 October 2022

It is now illegal* to provide, sell or manufacture the following plastic products in Aotearoa New Zealand:



Pre-formed **PVC food trays and containers** used for produce, baked goods, or meat only



Polystyrene takeaway food and drink packaging from a restaurant, café or food stall (eg, trays, containers, bowls, cups)



Expanded polystyrene food and drink packaging for takeaway (eg, clamshells) and sold at retail (eg, instant noodle cups)



Plastics with pro-degradant additives to accelerate fragmentation into smaller pieces such as oxo and photo-degradable (eg, some bin liners and dog poo bags)



Plastic drink stirrers 44



A cotton bud^{aa} with a plastic stem or a synthetic fibre bud wrapped around any type of stem

rom 1 October 2022 it became illegal to provide, sell or manufacture the following plastic products in Aotearoa New Zealand:

- · Single use plastic drink stirrers
- Single use plastic cotton buds
- Degradable plastics eg oxo and photo degradable
- · Certain PVC food trays and containers
- Polystyrene takeaway food and beverage packaging
- Expanded polystyrene food and beverage packaging

For many businesses, 1st October marks a new beginning in the way we operate. This means you may have to start using alternatives for packaging.

At the Ministry, they will be taking an educa-

tional approach with businesses to help with compliance. However, they will take enforcement action where necessary which may include handing out fines of up to \$100,000 to those who deliberately don't follow the new rules.

Traveling Cottage

ou may have noticed some new
Roller Door Artwork in town. Our
latest piece is on the door of Chang
Thai Cafe.

We wish to thank the Maungakiekie-Tāmaki Local Board for funding this installation, featuring the artwork of Leo Alonso.

The artists description of this piece is; "There is a sense of nostalgia and permanence associated with the cottages in this area. In time, it flows and adapts, recalling old times, and telling stories from the past with its strong foundations"

Originally from Colombia, Leo is an Artist, Graphic and Character Designer and Illustrator based in Auckland. Always an enthusiast of motivating people to express themselves through art, this has led him to teach as part of his career.

Panmure has built up an extensive collection of roller door art. The project's start was early in 2020 when the PBA was offered a Development Response package



from Auckland Transport to mitigate the effects of the AMETI Eastern Busway construction. One of the projects decided on was to enliven as many roller doors as possible. By the end of 2021, there was artwork on 10 roller doors along the length of Queens Road, Panmure.

Furthermore, several designs have been added to other areas within Panmure, creating a welcoming and creative space

for all to enjoy at any time. Iwi involvement has been paramount, to ensure collaboration with the community.

The murals have received very positive responses from the public and businesses wanting their roller door to be painted. Local residents are delighted that their once shabby town centre is looking and feeling more enlivened.
