The shop is well organized by colour, as Jennifer and Joy have quickly learned from the local customers' shopping habits - some of them select particular colours because of cultural needs, some of them are attending parties with themes – so they've made it very easy for you to quickly make your selection! There are all sorts of styles available, from casual to party dresses, sizes starting at XL up to 6XL, which you won't be able to find in the malls. There is a grand opening sale which finishes on 31st October, with 3 items for \$100 (while stocks last) plus they will be starting a loyalty scheme soon too, where the 10th item is free – so they clearly want to take care of their customers and keep them returning!

To top it off, they regularly donate stock to a charity called Care for Families, for them to re-sell to support their work (care4families.org) – so a real feel good factor too!

Aucklanders will get the chance to safely explore the site and learn more

about projects for Panmure.

You will also get the chance to learn about Watercare's carbon reduction journey.

Watercare project manager Jason Salmon explained "To help achieve our ambitious target to reduce our carbon emissions in infrastructure by 2025, we're working with local suppliers and construction partners like Fletchers and Fulton Hogan to achieve low carbon solutions, especially here in the heart of Panmure."

Dunkirk Pump Station Open Day is on Saturday, October 29, from 10am to 2pm on the corner of Dunkirk Road, and Tangaroa St. Entry is free.

Exciting upgrade for Panmure's Clifton Court

C lifton Court is set to become an exciting new public space. Eke Panuku is developing the site to create a flexible, open area and seating for social gatherings, recreation, small events, and outside learning – reflecting the Panmure community's desire for Clifton Court to become a greener, more inviting space.

There will be beautiful native and exotic planting, new lighting to improve visibility for a safer environment, and a new children's play space which will reflect a mana whenua narrative unique to Panmure. There will also be bike parking to promote active transport and a welcoming connection to Clifton Court from Pilkington Road.

Construction work is scheduled to begin on October 3 and run until March 2023. The area being upgraded (the central public area of the Court) will be fenced off, but there will be continued access for businesses and residents. Traffic Management personnel will be on site to assist pedestrians and manage vehicle access to ensure public safety.

This is the first of many investments Eke Panuku will be making in the area over the next decade as part of its Unlock Panmure programme, which aims to reinvigorate the town centre into becoming a great place to live, visit and do business.



ConneXion Annual Conference
