

# The Citrus is in Town!

he Citrus by Ambula had its grand opening last month and has already recived a fair share of eager visitors. Their previous establishment, Ambula has been a favourite for those seeking authentic Sri Lankan cuisine in Panmure. The business was started by Wickie Dharmaratne and has remained family owned.

The business has experienced a lot of growth over the seven years it has been running. Positive reviews and

recommendations via word of mouth saw the restaurant gradually outgrow its old location in our town center. Thus began the undertaking to move into a new building.

The change in location comes with a new name for the restaurant: The Citrus. The inside had been done up with new interior furnishings. This includes the soft, low hanging ceiling lights that create an alluring atmosphere for dining.

Even just two weeks after opening, manager Sri Rajapaksha reported that the

restaurant had seen a string of busy nights and many new faces.

With the re-opening, has come an expansion of the already wide menu. Along with the authentic Sri Lankan dishes, a variety of other western foods have been added - including salads. The restaurant has also added a kid friendly menu and a buffet option. This expansion in food offerings means that there is something to be found for everyone at The Citrus.

#### **TOWN MANAGER'S REPORT**

The Panmure Business Association held its 71st Annual General Meeting on Monday 2nd October. It was a good event for our members in attendance to receive reports of the association's activities carried out in the past financial year, hear about the current trajectory of the association, as well as vote to approve the proposed budget for the 2024/2025 financial year. This year, members approved a 3% increase to the Business Improvement District targeted rate, in recognition of the difficulties faced by our business community, but also the need to keep up with inflation and rising cost of goods and services.

The election of the Executive Committee 2023/2024 also took place. Our committee must consist of between 5-11 members and this year, we had a number of members renew their commitment, while we also welcomed 3 new members. Keep an eye out for next month's issue where we will feature our Committee members.

2023 is an election year, so make sure you get out and vote! You can vote in our very own Panmure Library, so be sure to miss the queues and vote early before polls close on Election Day, October 14th.



### **Cast Your Vote!**

It's General Election season once again. Due to the importance of this event, more efforts have been made in recent years to make sure voting is accessible and everyone can participate. Despite this, Elections NZ has reported that in the last three General Elections, approximately 21% of eligible voters opted to not participate in the voting process.

In the 2020 General Elections, Panmure was included as one of the regions that contributed significantly to this statistic. It is important that our community is properly represented in the decision making of our country. To aid with that process, we have provided the following information about voting locations in our community:

Election day falls on the 14th of October this year. However, you do not have to wait until then to cast your vote. Two early voting sites in our area include: The Mt

Wellington Bowling Club (3 Matapan Road), and Panmure Library (7-13 Pilkington Road).

Both locations opened for early voting from October 2nd and will remain available until October 13th. Voting times at Mt Wellington Bowling Club run from 10am – 3pm. Panmure Library's voting times run from 10am-4pm.

On Election Day itself (October 14th), the following places will be set up for voting from 9am-7pm:

- •Panmure Bridge Primary School (76 Kings Road, Panmure)
- •Ruapotaka Primary School (10A Taratoa Street, Point England)
- •Te Whare Rangimarie (7-13 Pilkington Road)
